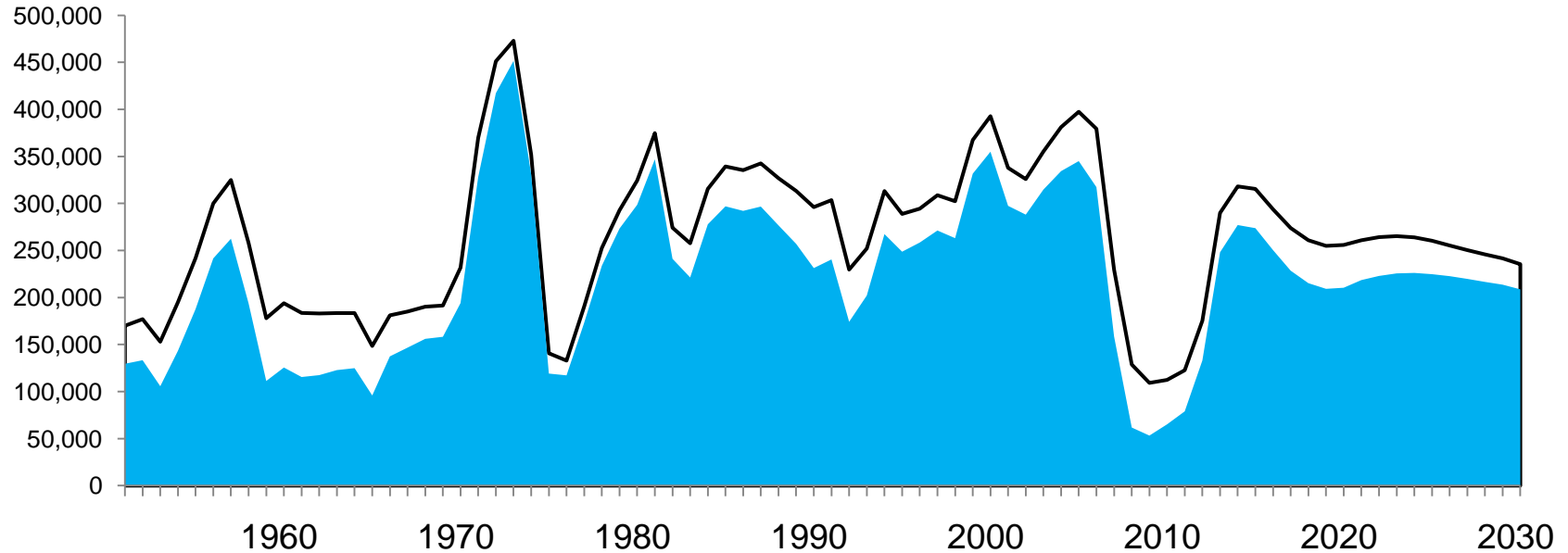
Annual Change in Population

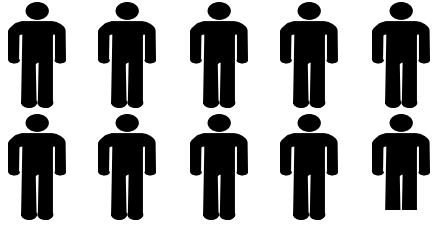
Annual Change in Population...Largely Net In-Migration

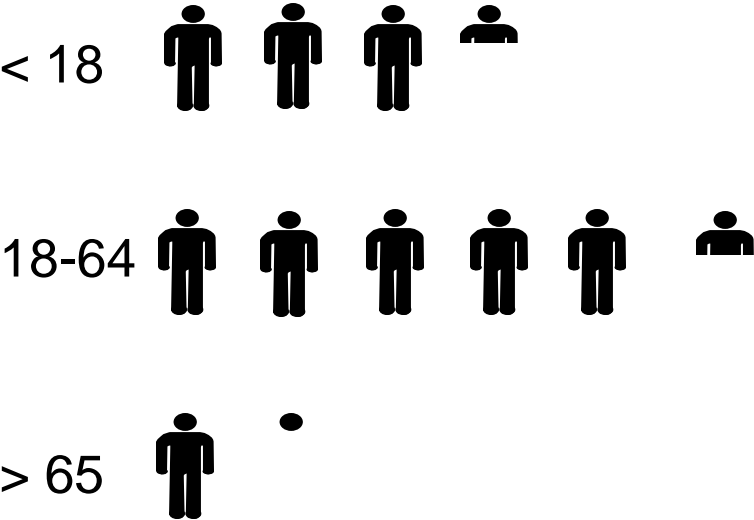

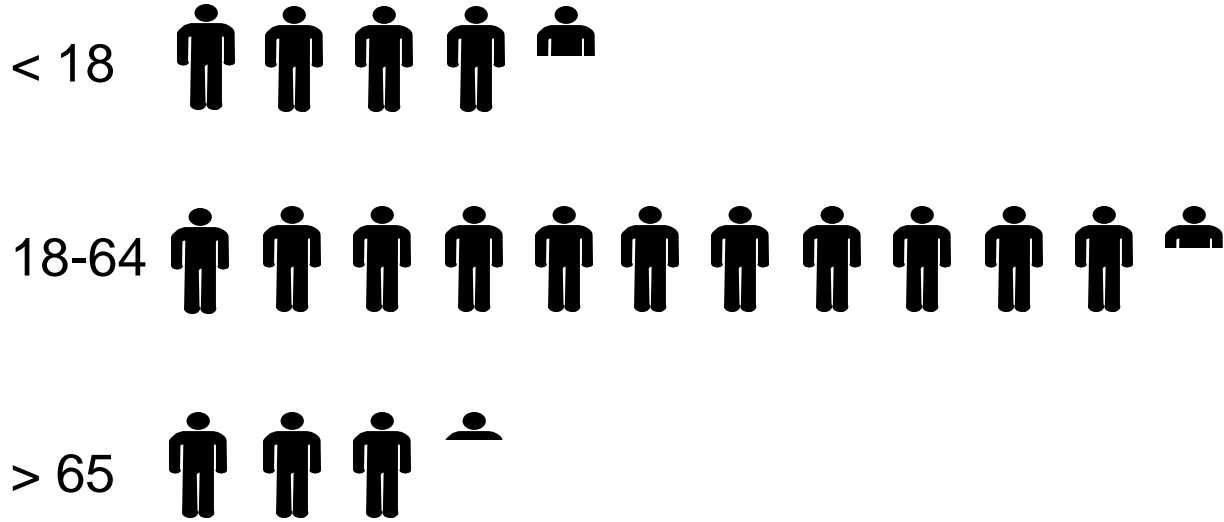
1960 age distribution
